#### -s, --split-only

split long lines, but do not refill

# -t, --tagged-paragraph

indentation of first line different from second

#### -u, --uniform-spacing

one space between words, two after sentences

#### -w, --width=WIDTH

maximum line width (default of 75 columns)

# -g, --goal=WIDTH

goal width (default of 93% of width)

output version information and exit
